I am a sociologist by training with research interests in migration and social change in the Gulf, international migration of labour, diaspora, refugees, immigrant businesses, migration and development, migration policy and immigrant integration issues in the region. My research sites are interregional, embracing the Gulf countries and Southeast and South Asian countries. I hold a doctoral degree in Sociology from the National University of Singapore (NUS), for which I was supported by the prestigious NUS research scholar award. I was also awarded a (U.S.) Social Science Research Council (SSRC) doctoral fellowship in 2001. As a researcher, I have consistently endeavored to conduct cutting-edge research in my field and to publish findings in international peer-reviewed journals. As a result, four of my journal articles were ranked as the top ten cited and/or downloaded articles in ISI and Scopus journals in various years. In my research, I adopt a robust interdisciplinary approach, enabled by my understanding of qualitative and quantitative methods, and insights from other social science disciplines. From 2005-2007, I was a Postdoctoral Fellow at the prestigious Asia Research Institute (ARI), NUS, which is named by the Rockefeller Foundation as one of the 29 research centers of excellence. From 2007-2015, I was research fellow and senior research fellow at the National University of Singapore. From 2015-2018, I was Associate Professor at the Institute of Asian Studies, the Universiti Brunei Darussalam, Brunei Darussalam. I was a member of Migration Research Leaders Syndicate for the 2018 Global Compact on Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration, formed and spearheaded by the International Organization for Migration (IOM) – the UN Migration Agency - based in Geneva. I am currently Series Editor for the *Gulf Studies Book Series*, Springer Nature.
